The holy great martyr Theodore Stratelates suffered for Christ in Herakleia on 8 February 319. At the time of his sufferings he ordered his servant Uaros to bury his body on the estate of his parents in Eukhaitos. The transfer of his relics took place on 8 June 319.





e - ter - nal bles - sings for them that ho - nor your mem - o - ry with faith.


