**TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST**

**Prokeimenon of the Resurrection** (Psalm 28:11,1,2):

The Lord will give strength to his peo - ple; the Lord  
 will bless, will bless his peo - ple with peace.

*Verse:* Bring to the Lord, you sons of God; bring to the Lord glory and honor.

**Prokeimenon of a martyr - Tone 7** (Psalm 63:11,2)

The just man will re-joyce in the Lord, re - joyce in the Lord  
 and will put his trust in him.

**Alleluia of the Resurrection - Tone 7** (Psalm 91:2,3):

*Verse:* It is good to give thanks to the Lord and to sing praises to your name, O Most High.

*Verse:* To proclaim your mercy in the morning, and your faithfulness throughout the night.

**Alleluia of a Martyr - Tone 4** (Psalm 91:13,14):

*Verse:* The just man will flourish like the palm tree and grow like a cedar of Lebanon.

*Verse:* Planted in the house of the Lord, he will flourish in the courts of our God.

**The holy and great martyr Demetrius.** Born in Salonica of devout parents, he was a much-longed-for only child. Because of this he received an excellent education. Like his father, Demetrius became a soldier in the Roman army. The emperor Maximian appointed him to persecute the Christians in Salonica, but Demetrius confessed his faith and preached Christ. He was cruelly martyred for his witness to the Lord. Since earliest times, he has been regarded as a wonderworker and powerful intercessor. (305)





**Troparion of the holy great-martyr Demetrius - Tone 3**




O mar-tyr, the world has seen you as a de-fend-er of those

**Kontakion of the Resurrection - Tone 7**




No long-er can the might of Death rule o-ver us; Christ de-scend-ed,
