The Synaxis of the holy seventy Apostles, whose names were recorded by Saint Dorotheus. In addition to the Twelve Apostles, our Lord chose seventy other apostles and sent them out to preach. (cf. Luke 10:1-5)

Our venerable father Theoctist, hegumen of Cuomo in Sicily founded a monastery in the city of Kucuma on the island of Sicily, where he became hegumen. At his monastery lived Greek monks, who had fled persecution by the iconoclasts. (800)





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

 and who clothed the hu-man race with im - mor - tal - i - ty.







put on the first robe. He has appeared to re - new all cre - a - tion.


Cantor: (Tone 4) Because with the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption,
