

**Vespers with Divine Liturgy, Evening of March 25, 2009**  
**Thursday in the Fifth Week of the Great Fast**  
**ANNUNCIATION OF THE THEOTOKOS AND EVER-VIRGIN MARY**

*(If the Annunciation falls on a Lenten weekday, the Divine Liturgy of Our Holy Father John Chrysostom is celebrated with Vespers on March 25, in the evening.)*

*Supplement for **The Divine Liturgies of our Holy Fathers John Chrysostom and Basil the Great, 2006**. Music for the cantor verses can be found in the official **Cantors' Companion**, or on the **MCI Cantor Verses** book.*

*The service begins on DL 105; either setting of Psalm 103 may be sung. At the Lamp-lighting Psalms, "O Lord, I have cried" is sung in Tone 8 (DL 159). After the recited psalm verses (DL 114-115), the cantor and people sing the following stichera:*

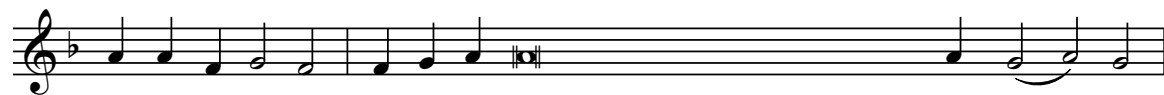

the brilliant, saving, and gleam-ing Light. He sings heav-enly and awesome hymns



to our souls.


**Cantor:** Strong is the love of the Lord for us;  
(on 1) he is faithful forever.




The great mys-tery, previously unknown to the angels and hid-den from e-ter-ni-ty,

wom-an's womb he is con-tained. The six - winged seraphim and the many-eyed  
cherubim cannot look up-on him; yet, with a single word, he has been pleased to  
take on flesh. He re-mains the Word of God. Why do I stand still and  
not say to the Maid - en: Re - joice, Full of Grace, the Lord is with you;  
Re-joyce, pure Vir - gin; re-joyce, Un - wed - ded Bride; re-joyce, Moth - er of Life;  
bless-ed is the fruit of your womb.

The sanctuary and the faithful are incensed.*
