Heart's faith makes us right; standing in the light, We con - fess our whole life long:




Kontakion of our venerable father Athanasius of Mount Athos - Tone 8

Note: the second kontakion (of the saint) is optional. If it is omitted, sing the Kontakion of the Resurrection at "Glory... now and ever..." in Tone 4:

Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - Tone 4 (Psalm 103:24,1):

How man-y are your works, O Lord. In wis-dom you have made them all.
In wis-dom you have made them all.

Verse: Bless the Lord, my soul. Lord my God, how great you are.

And then immediately:

Prokeimenon of a venerable - Tone 7

Pre-cious in the eyes, in the eyes of the Lord is the death

Alleluia of the Resurrection - Tone 4 (Psalm 44:5,8):

Alleluia of a venerable - Tone 6 (Psalm 111:1,2):
