Twenty-eighth Sunday after Pentecost


The holy prophet Nahum, who preached that God rules the course of times and judges the people with justice.

Stichera of the holy prophet Nahum - Tone 3 samohlasen




The grace of the Ho-ly Sp-rit rest-ed u-pon you, O Na-hum, Pro-phet of God;
