

Vesper Propers, November 13, 2016
Twenty-sixth Sunday after Pentecost

Our holy father John Chrysostom, archbishop of Constantinople. Born in Antioch, he was ordained to the priesthood and found worthy of the title Chrysostom because of his golden eloquence. Chosen for the see of Constantinople, he showed himself to be the best pastor and teacher of the faith. He was forced into exile by his enemies. When he was recalled from his exile by a decree of Pope Saint Innocent I, having suffered many evils from the accompanying soldiers, he returned his soul to God on the fourteenth day of September at Comana in Pontus. Lamplighting Psalms in the Tone of the Week (Tone 1, p. 24), stichera 10-7. Then:


Cantor: (Tone 4) If you, O Lord, should mark our guilt, Lord who would survive?

(Repeat "Let us praise in song...")


Cantor: Let the watchman count on daybreak
(on 4) and Israel on the Lord.




Let us worthily honor John of the gold - en words, the nev - er - set - ting star,




man, the eagle of great and good speech and the treasury of virtues.




