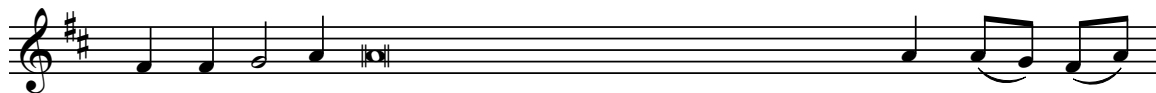
Troparion of Theodore - Tone 2
