


Divine Liturgy, July 10, 2016



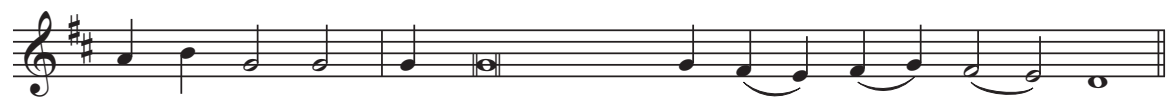
