


Divine Liturgy, July 10, 2022

Our venerable father Anthony of the Monastery of the Caves.


He was a hermit, who in the laura called “the Caves” followed the monastic life which he had learned on Mt. Athos. He was the founder of Russian monasticism.(1073)

cast-ing light o - ver all your home - land. Show - ing the path of the king-dom

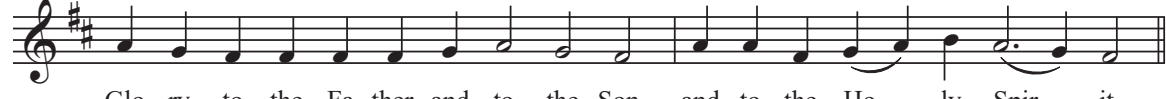


to all monks, you led them on to Christ: Now beg him to save our souls, O




Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - Tone 4 (Psalm 103:24,1):

Alleluia of the Resurrection - Tone 4 (Psalm 44:5,8):




Communion Hymns:
