

Vesper Propers, June 2, 2024
Second Sunday after Pentecost

Our venerable father Nicephorus the confessor, at the Bosphorus in Propontis. He was bishop of Constantinople and a most fierce champion of the tradition of the Fathers. For the cult of holy icons, he steadfastly opposed himself to the iconoclastic emperor Leo the Armenian. Leo then forced him from his see and sent him for a long time to a monastery, from which he departed to God with a calm spirit. (771)
