
The holy martyr Tatiana, who died in Rome under Emperor Alexander Severus. (c.227)

Lamplighting Psalms in the Tone of the Week (Tone 1, p. 102), stichera 10-7.


Cantor: (Tone 8) If you, O Lord, should mark our guilt, Lord, who would survive?
