(on 3) Israel indeed he will redeem from all its iniquity.



(on 2) acclaim him, all you peoples!



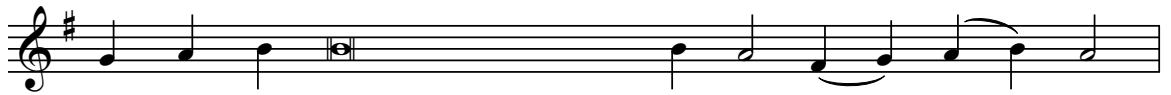
You lived un-known at the threshold of your no-ble par-ents' house, O
